Jessica's story

Twelve-year-old Jessica would wake at 5 every morning to walk to the river before school. The river was the only source of water for all the families and animals in her district. And because it was a long walk down a steep valley, Jessica would often miss the start of school.

"I used to worry about being late for school and that my teacher would hate me," Jessica told us. But since her community constructed a water system with the help of Oxfam, Jessica is not only on time, but she fits in some extra study in the mornings!

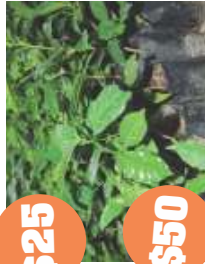

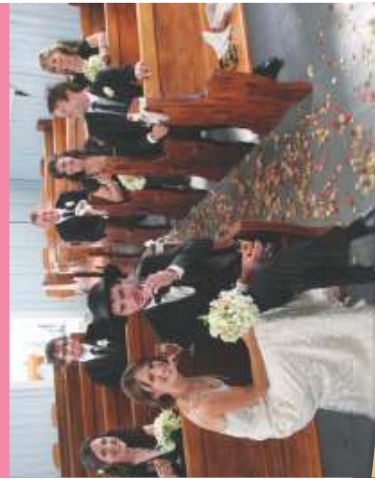

OXFAM IS THERE

Oxfam's emergency team arrived in Samoa immediately following the devastating tsunami in 2009, and we continue working to ensure that affected communities have safe water and sanitation facilities. We are also supporting the long-term rebuilding of people's livelihoods in rural communities.

The tsunami swept away Loliga Filo's home and crops. Her family now lives inland on a community plantation. Oxfam provided tarpaulins and guttering to attach to their temporary shelter for rainwater collection. The family now has access to safe drinking water in their own backyard.

"Before the water system we had to walk over a kilometre with small containers to find a working water tap. It often wasn't enough for the whole family," said Loliga. The water has enabled them to irrigate their newly-planted banana, cocoa, lime, and rambutan plants.

"I prefer living this way rather than relying on relatives overseas to send us money. If the plants produce well we can sell them and make money. We're making use of the land for the future of our kids."

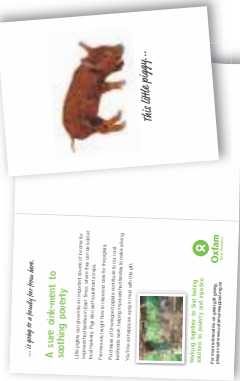
